Title I, Part A: Improving the Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged

Title III: English Language Acquisition Grants

- Strengthen home-to-school connections by offering home access to an interactive, engaging math application.

Response to Intervention

Response to Intervention (RTI) is a framework integrating assessment and intervention within a multitiered system to maximize student achievement. Districts may use up to 15 percent of IDEA (Individual with Disabilities Education Act) funds for students not identified as needing special education but possibly needing additional academic help to succeed.

DreamBox Learning can support RTI by:

- Offering instruction tiers that adjust the intensity and nature of the intervention depending on individual student progress.
- Ensuring teachers have accurate, real-time data about student progress via ongoing formative assessments and teacher dashboards.
- Continually assessing and adapting to provide individualized instruction and an appropriate level of difficulty for each student.
- Providing an interactive, individualized math program aligned to the Common Core State Standards.
- Increasing student achievement by using an evidence-based adaptive instructional program.

School Improvement Grants

School Improvement Grants (SIGs) are designed to improve student achievement in eligible schools (i.e., identified for improvement, corrective action, or restructuring) by implementing intervention models: (1) turnaround, (2) restart, (3) school closure, or (4) transformation.
